Dr. Xiansheng Tian, Professor of History, joined the Metro State University of Denver in 1996. His book, *Patrick J. Hurley and American Policy in China, 1944-1945*, was published in 2009, which details one of the pivotal diplomatic missions of the twentieth century. He also co-edited three other books, *Evolution of Power: China's Struggle, Survival, and Success*, (2014), *New Historiography in the Contemporary West on Chinese History: 1987-2007* (2007) and *Taiwan in the Eyes of Chinese-American Scholars: Critical Analysis of Taiwanese Society in the 21st Century* (2004). He also contributed chapters to books like *Ethnic China: Identity, Assimilation, and Resistance* (2015), *Discovering History in America* (2008), *Society, Modernity, and Cultural Identity in Taiwan: A Historical Revisit* (2001), *Asia's Crisis and New Paradigm* (2000), *Taiwan in Historical Perspective: Post-War Economy, Politics, Culture, Education, and External Relations* (1999), and *China and the United States: A New Cold War History* (1999). He has served on the Boards of Directors of the *Chinese Historians in the United States* and the *Association of Chinese Professors in Social Sciences*. He is also on the Editorial Board of *American Review of China Studies*.
